



What to Look for in an Intensive Intervention Program

Just as adults have specific learning styles, so do children. The learning style must match the most effective way the child processes information (i.e., visually, verbally, hands-on, etc.) and the child’s personality. Some people learn best when they are taught using linear, concrete, and highly structured methods (such as with behavior-based methods), whereas others learn best through incidental teaching or through hands-on learning (such as with child-centered methods). Learning methods are not right or wrong and each method can teach the same skills. The question really is, which method works best for your child and family. Below is a checklist to help point you in the right direction.

What methods work best for my child and family, Behavior-Based (ABA or Verbal Behavior) or Child-Centered (Floortime)?

Question	Behavior-Based	Child-Centered
My child learns best and is happiest when s/he learns	In structured environments (i.e., sitting at the table and focusing)	While playing
I can get my child to do things when I	Tell him/her directly what s/he needs to do	Coach, prod, negotiate, let him/her think it’s his/her idea, etc.
My child learns best when taught one thing at a time instead of the whole concept (i.e., the color blue vs. these are colors and this one crayon is blue)	For example, when learning colors, my child works best if it sit him/her down at a table or on the floor and practice “drilling” one color at a time using crayons (i.e., saying, “this is blue” and asking the child then to “touch the blue crayon”)	For example, when learning colors, my child works best if we take out crayons and color. I will label the colors and my child eventually learns them or going on a color hunt and asking my child to find everything that is blue in the house.
I have other children that I would like to be part of the session	Generally not	Usually not a problem
